



OUR 111TH CAROL SERVICE



HISTORY OF OUR CAROL SERVICE

The first Carols service was held on the last day of the last term in 1913 – that was before the first world war!

Mrs Anderson, the Principal at the time, started the Carols in order to raise funds for cots that would bring comfort and rest to ill children at the Children's Hospital.

£12 was collected at the service in 1913.

The first Carols was held in the Stevenson Hall in the Old School in Bird Street, but it soon moved to the Feather Market Centre.

Grey boys would use the silver trophies to take a silver collection at the end of the service.

Only once since 1913 has Carols been cancelled — and that was in 1944 when South Africa was battling an epidemic of the poliomyelitis virus. However, in 2020 and 2021, the Covid pandemic could not stop us — we did a broadcast in 2020 and had an online carol service in 2021 where the community could donate online to the worthy cause that we support.

In 1979, the service was recorded for broadcast on SABS radio.

In 1981, it was filmed to be presented as a Christmas Eve

programme on television.

Between 1984 and 1985, the popular Collegiate Carols was moved back to the school, to its present location in Parsons Hill, as the Feather Market Centre was a potential fire risk.

A few years of Carols Performances followed at the then University of Port Elizabeth Sport Centre,

With the refurbishing of the new Feather Market Centre in 1994, Collegiate Carols returned to the then grand building.

We see how history repeats itself as the Feather Market Centre is again a safety risk with parts of the building and stage in disrepair. Hence, we had Carols in our beautiful quad for a second time around. Just as last year, we had nervous moments in the days leading up to Carols with regards to the weather but we were so blessed, yet again, when the prayers of many were answered — the wind was calm and the night was still and beautiful. From the opening strains of *Come Thou Fount of every blessing* to the closing strains of the *Benedictus* your voices soared and peace truly filled the quad.

St Augustine's Outreach

Collegiate is in the process of building relationships with the St Augustine's Primary School learners and renovating their library. The goal is for this to be fully realised in 2024 when Collegiate celebrates its 150th birthday. St Augustine's Primary School in Central, built in 1847, is the oldest primary school in the heart of Gqeberha. It is a government school with limited funding. We are grateful for the generous donations of paint that we have received, as well as the book donations. Our learners and staff have been cleaning, varnishing and painting the library this holiday.


