Much excitement filled the corridors and classrooms yesterday. With the return of all girls and the arrival of the new Grade Eights, the school came alive once more, friendships were rekindled, and an air of anticipation of what is to come abounded. The sesquicentennial year of the Collegiate Schools – the year in which Collegiate turns 150 – has arrived and it will be a year to remember.

In the opening assembly we dedicated 2024 to be a year of celebration:

After the assembly, the entire school gathered in the front garden for the 150 Flag-raising Ceremony. As 2024 is the sesquicentenary of the school, a flag signifying the 150th anniversary of the school had been designed and it was unveiled and raised for the first time yesterday by the Head and Deputy Head Girls, Blessing Melariri and Mignonne Coley. The flag symbolizes Collegiate, unifies and reminds us of our identity as a school. The 150-flag will be flown every school day this year.

Academic excellence does not only pertain to technology: a learner who has all their stationery, textbooks and subject related requirements is well positioned for a good start to the year. Please ensure that your daughter has all the equipment and resources required for each of her subjects as a matter of urgency.

We would like to extend our congratulations to **Mrs Grobbelaar** on her appointment as the Grade Twelve Grade Head, **Mrs Dos Santos**, the Grade Ten Grade Head and **Mrs Vanderlinden**, the Grade Nine Grade Head. Two 150 Jubilee projects are currently underway. A new walkway with a seated area in the centre is under construction in the front garden. Once this and the landscaping is complete, it will be a truly beautiful and peaceful haven.



The second project is the conversion of the building behind the Games Club into a Fitness Centre, and the extension of the Games Club deck towards the water polo arena. The Fitness Centre will be a valuable addition to our sporting programme, especially once an on-site biokineticist is appointed to provide high-performance training.

Lastly, we are pleased to welcome "Die Hoofmeisies" to the Ivy Leaf Tuckshop and to The Games Club. The Tuckshop now includes a coffee machine and barista, a wider menu and more substantial items. All payments can be made with debit cards, and we will soon implement the D6 wallet payment system.

I am aware that you have been inundated with paperwork in the last two days. At Collegiate we are always mindful of our paper usage, but in some instances, we have to rely on paper in order for us to update our administrative systems and keep record of all the important information. After the initial paperwork we will be using digital platforms to communicate with learners and parents alike.
